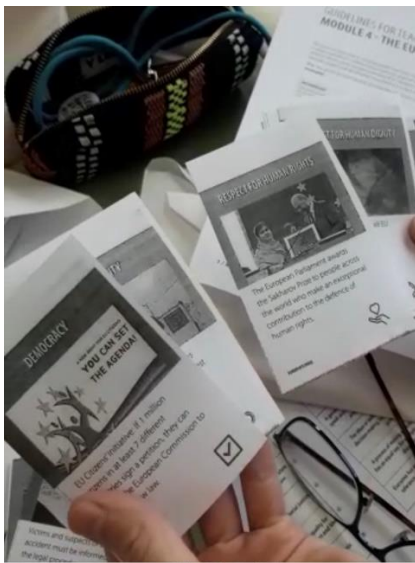


THE EUROPEAN VALUES: CITIZENSHIP
